



Deep Run Junior Corbin to Play Soccer at Coastal Carolina

Glen Allen, Va. (December 15, 2011) – Christina Corbin, a junior at Deep Run High School, has verbally committed to play soccer at Coastal Carolina University in 2013.

Christina currently plays for the nationally ranked VSA Heat. She has earned 1st. Team All-District, 2nd. Team All- Regional, 2nd. Team All Metro, Athlete of the Week in May 2011 and All Academic honors as a starting forward for Deep Run High School Women's Soccer Team. Last season she led the team in goals at 26 and led the team to a 23-1 record, winning for the first time in school history the Colonial District and Central Regional Championship. Christina also played in the Virginia State ODP program, representing Virginia 4 times in the Region 1 Tournament and then representing Virginia and the United States in Costa Rica, Austria and the Czech Republic playing against each respective countries women's pro and national teams.

Coastal Carolina University first noticed Christina at U15 when she guest played with an older team from her club. Coastal identified her for her speed, field vision, composure, and work rate.

She chose Coastal Carolina University after considering Minnesota, Missouri, Virginia Commonwealth University, Florida International University, and Samford University, to name a few.

"I feel Coastal is a great fit for me and I love the feel of the campus, its location doesn't hurt either" said Christina. "Coach Hogan is known for building a winning program and I believe in what he is doing with the team. Knowing that I have the chance to make an immediate impact and that Coach Hogan was truly interested in me, makes everything really exciting."

Competing in the Big South Conference, head coach Paul Hogan will be entering into his third season when Christina joins the team. Coach Hogan comes from the University of Colorado where after arriving it took two years for Coach Hogan to direct the Buffaloes to a season Big XII title, the first in school history, and Big XII Tournament Finals in 2005, 2006 and 2008. In his 10 years at Colorado he competed in six NCAA Tournaments, including a run to the Sweet 16 during the 2006 season being ranked #15 nationally. Coach Hogan's expectations at Coastal are no where short of exceeding what he did at Colorado.
