



## Robinson Secondary Junior Miller to Play Soccer at Auburn University

Fairfax, VA (October 12, 2011)- Savannah Miller, a junior new to Robinson Secondary School, has verbally committed to play soccer at Auburn University in 2013. Savannah, a versatile player, earned first team All- District honors, All-Region Honorable mention, as well as the Daily Press All-Stars Second team last season at Smithfield High School which is a part of the Bay Rivers District. Savannah led her team in goals averaging about 25 per season. She was awarded the Most Valuable Offensive Player Award both her Freshman and Sophomore year. Savannah is also an outside back, and a forward on the nationally ranked VSA Heat club soccer team.

Miller chose Auburn University after considering William and Mary, Boston University, UNC Wilmington, and American University, among others.

"Auburn is a dream come true", said Savannah. " The pride and atmosphere of the school is so contagious and incredible. Having the opportunity to contribute to such a great soccer program just gives me more motivation to work harder."

The head coach of the Auburn soccer program since 1999, Karen Hoppa has guided the club to seven SEC Western Division Championships and nine NCAA Tournament berths over the past 12 seasons, including a school record five consecutive from 2006-10, and moved into elite status in the history of Division I women's soccer at the end of last season.
