



R.E. Lee Junior Neves to Play Soccer at West Virginia

Springfield (August 10, 2011) – Daniela Neves, a rising junior at R.E. Lee High School, has verbally committed to play soccer at West Virginia University in 2013.

Neves, a forward, earned All-District honors her first two seasons and led Lee in scoring both years. This past season she also led the team in assists and was named the team's most valuable player. Neves is a starting forward on the nationally ranked VSA Heat club soccer team and was the kicker on Lee's freshman football team in 2009.

"I am excited to play at West Virginia," said Neves. "The facilities are great and coach Izzo-Brown has built a great program. I look forward to contributing to the team."

West Virginia, a perennial contender under head coach Nicki Izzo-Brown, is the reigning Big East Conference champion and has reached the NCAA women's soccer tournament 11 straight years, including a sweet 16 appearance last year.
